We are working in a tribal area in Alirajpur. In our project area covering the 9 villages, small marginal farmers are found having wells and dyke/canals as a major sources for irrigation. Due to scarcity of water they used to find difficulty in irrigation related work from the month of February itself.

Watershed activities in this area increased water availability by increasing water level which in turn helped the farmers in proper irrigation during rabi season and also solved the drinking water problem.

WASH in schools (Community development program under ITC Mission Sunehara kal)

Background

WASH-in-Schools is integral to every school's aim of providing children with an enabling learning environment, which must include the provision of safe water, adequate and appropriate (child-friendly and gender-sensitive) sanitation and hand washing facilities together with hygiene education. Effective WASH-in-Schools helps to ensure a positive learning environment by allowing every child access to a safe school environment that helps enhance their learning abilities. It also aims to promote positive life skills, participatory and leadership skills through proper maintenance of facilities and a sense of responsibility.

Work done so far

Since year 2015-16 VIBHAVARI has been implementing school level WASH programme in Ichhawar and Sehore block of Sehore district with support from ITC Limited.

Innovations in WASH

WAHH KIT: WAHH KIT, an innovative activity-based knowledge kit, which is a complete training toolkit for Swachchh Vidhalaya. The activities conducted by this kit disseminate the water and sanitation message effectively. It has a collection of tools and posters to address all the stockholders of School WASH program including Child Cabinet, teachers, SMS members & MDM workers.

Soap Bank: Soap Bank is a new innovation by Vibhavari to ensure availability of soap in schools for hand wash. Child Cabinet has passed a resolution that every student will donate a soap to school on his/her birthday. This evokes a proud feeling of contributing something and in turn receiving genuine wishes by other students. The Soap Bank is a very successful and sustainable modal and is spreading on its own. During this financial year total 897 soap have been collected.

Pad bank: As Insinuator has been installed in girls' toilet of all the Model schools of Guna-Shivpuri which had been a great help in disposal of sanitary waste. Along with this,VIBHAVARI have initiated PAD BANK scheme in modal (middle) schools. PAD BANK is an innovation by Vibhavari which aims at providing a comfort zone to the adolescent girls. For making a PAD BANK, teenagers (girls from middle school) form a club in which they contribute for pads and a maintaining a box for the same and refill it as per their requirement. This innovation got good response in all the modal schools of Guna —shivpuri by female teachers too who are also members in PAD Banks. This small initiative gave immense confidence to girls.

Grey Water Reuse: Vibhavari always plan for a holistic approach in implementing any task. In order to work for WASH in school we planned to save water and manage grey water alongside. For this, earlier VIBHAVARI developed a model of hand WASH Unit and attached it with urinal in such a way the grey water which comes through hand washing can be used in urinal directly. This small innovation had benefits in two fold. First, it saved blue water which was used in urinal. Second, it solved the stagnation of grey water as the same quantity is being used in hand wash and in urinal cleaning. Now blue water expense is halved and grey water goes to pit via urinal. In some schools we diverted the grey water to kitchen garden also. This change can be seen as beautiful flowers near the hand wash units or near the hand pumps.

Special Achievements

Community participation in WASH

As the project is very challenging in terms of community contribution. We have planned for conducting Door to Door meetings with all stake holders at field level for project implementation and discussed on its component Therefore we have achieved contribution of Rs. 129100 during this financial year.

Regular fund collection by stakeholders for O&M

A fund collection system has been developed for operation and maintenance of WASH structures in every school from all stakeholders including PRI, SMC, School staff, and community and line department by giving them fund box, where children and teachers collect some money in it every month. Fund collection of Rs. 224640 in fund box has been done during this year.

Child friendly school WASH infra-structure

Child, gender friendly sanitary blocks in schools have constructed with separate WES facilities for Boys and Girls. Other needful structures like boundary walls, Hand wash units, washing stations for mid-day meal workers, roof water harvesting etc. have developed in these six school campuses. Availability of running water for toilet and hand wash area, availability of safe drinking water, management of bio and non-bio waste, maintenance of drainage system are other facilities been ensured in all campuses.

Competition on WASH awareness

We have conducted a program related to WASH in which we arranged a competition of drawing and painting.

WASH in culture

Global hand washing day, world toilet day, Swachhata pakhwada, poem competition etc celebrated in schools

Enrolment Drive

With objective of increasing enrolment of children in government schools, enrollment drives carried out in project villages. Community meetings, rallies, distribution of pamphlets, celebrating 'Praveshotsava & Pratibha samman' etc. were the main activities conducted for this purpose. Street plays performed in in order to enhance interest of community and parents towards government schools and attract them towards the facilities being provided by government in the schools.

Outcome:

- ➤ Vibhavari has constructed about approx 81000 cu.mt Treatment (Khet khanti) in our 28 field villages with the purpose to reduce soil erosion, increase ground water, field protection & encouraged organic farming.
- ➤ Pasture land development of 18 hectare area of 04 plots in our three villages has been done for protection against CCT, CPT and plantation in this area. We had also done exposure visit of farmers on pasture land at agar malwa district at nipaniya & betkheda village with local farmers & community to develop pasture land area and learn the process follow by them.
- > Stop dam (check dam) is constructed at jamuniya fatehpur & Dhabla mata for irrigation purpose and 2 WUG's are formed for operation & maintenance of structure. We developed storage capacity & command area.

Climate Smart Agriculture:

The aim of the program is to Dissemination of knowledge on **climate smart agriculture practices** with a focus on small and marginal farmers and encourage farmers for adopting advance farming. The Climate Smart Agriculture program has been implemented of 117 villages. The interventions includes soil testing, zero tillage, BBF, Seed Treatment, use of solar trap and other advance practices.

Other activities:

Training on Water budgeting

We have conducted training on water budget with the support of farmers at Village Ramnagar Ichhawar. In this training discussion about water requirement in village for domestic use, irrigation purpose & total water availability and need of water calculation was done.

Exposure visit IISR

We have conducted exposure visit at IISR Indore for our csv super champion farmer for all locations Sehore, Ratlam and Agar. The director of IISR Dr.V.S.BHATIYA discussed about the methodology and research to use permanent BBF, BBF, zero tillage / minimum tillage in Rabi season & other agriculture activities on CSV. After that discussion on POP & field demonstration by all scientists was done.

Cluster level Workshop on CSV

We conducted Cluster level Workshop on CSV at our all three Sehore, Ratlam and Agar and covered farmers from 109 field villages with the aim of increasing their knowledge and skills. The main agenda of workshop was towards all five components of climate smart village like water smart, seed smart, nutrient smart, weather smart, market smart.

Training on Integrated Farming System

We conducted two days residential training programme on Integrated Farming System at KVK sevaniya, ichhavar District Sehore for our field farmers for creating awareness about IFS. Approximate 40 farmers attended this training program.

World Soil Health Day

We organized world soil health day at Parsukhedi Agar, Sehore & Ratlam. Discussion on soil health as how to save soil and why need of soil test, carbon, soil moisture etc was done by our Chief guest of Mr. R. P. Kaneriya DDA Dr. R. P.S. Saktawat from KVK.

Agree Business Centre Strengthening-

We conducted village level meeting for strengthening of ABC group and discussed on what , why , & How .

SHG promotion program

Vibhavari is conducting in SHG promotion program in 30 villages of sehore district since 2015 focusing on health and nutritional aspect through different interventions (like kitchen garden, nursery development) and gender and financial inclusion trainings planned for the women SHG members.

Training on Ethno Practices

We organized training & technical support from TGT of Ethno Practices for the learning of 11 types of herbal medicine for better health of goat & discussion about all disease, Treatment and market linkages with support of ITC – MSK.

Pashu Sakhi (Monthly meeting)

We conducted Training at our project office Ichhavar — Sehore during April to March for pashusakhi and CLM of 30 villages with support of ITC mission sunharakal program. The purpose of this meeting was income generation, D2D Interaction with goat family, Kids Insurance, system for 16 management practices deworming and vaccination, castration, Dana Mishran , Masala Boles etc. and to add 16 new villages in our field area and to implement our practices in new 16 villages with support of PS & CLM.

Kids Nursery

PS & CLM were encouraged for market linkage for selling of 8 quintal of goat waste manure and 45 quintal dana mishran.

Market Linkage By PS

PS & CLM were encouraged for market linkage for selling of goats. They earned the net profit Rs.35800 from sale of 37 goats.

Special Achievements:

PASHU SAKHI: An innovative modal of sustainable livelihood and Goat rearing

A woman from each village has developed as a vat para worker for facilitation for goat rearing. 14 Pashu Sakhis are working for facilitating goat reares covering 30 villages. These Women the Pashu Sakhi have got an alternative source of livelihood and receiving an average income up to 4000/- per month. Two **Community Livestock Manager (CLM)** and 14 Pashu Sakhi at each selected village level are developed. These CLM have been facilitate pashusakhi and extend their technical help and Pashu sakhi would direct provide to services and knowledge to goat rearer.

New practices adopted including deworming, stall feeding, preparing Dana mishran, castration of Buck, vaccination and regular check up by Pashu sakhi. Support on IEC material, knowledge, best practices etc by TGT Providing strategic guidance and capacity building to team on the programme which has become helpful to implement the programme successfully. Provide support to develop these model as entrepreneur and institutional.

Mrs Reena bai from Village dudlai has joined SHG since 2017 and she self contributed her savings & took loan Rs. 10000 & started **Grocery Shop** – (income generating activity) for self livelihood. Now she is happy because she has started earning approx Rs. 3000 / month since last 2 years. Previously she was doing labour work and was earning approx Rs. 800 / month.

SHG (Outcome)

Total no. of 72 SHG with 817 women were formed in 16 Villages before March. During Dec. 19 no. of women increased to 802 with 71 SHG. Individual saving account of 760 women was opened & 716 women were covered by Accidental insurance, started RD, 34 girls were covered under Sukanya Scheme and 38 women were covered by pension plan. We had done bank linkage of SHG and certain other sources& released fund of rs. 3715000.

This program includes regular training program as 'Bakari Palak Pathshala' for providing information on advance goat rearing practices including Breed and breeding. Since year 2019-20 VIBHAVARI has been implementing school level WASH programme in Guna & Shivpuri districts with support from UNICEF. We have worked in total 2526 schools (Guna-1041 Shivpuri-1485) of Guna and Shivpuri districts.

- Cluster level training 1722 teacher (preferable HM) were skilled on WASH in school. Guna & shivpuri cluster level training.
- Block level review meeting 2358 SMC/PRI members were oriented on WASH in school.
- Celebration of global hand wash day and world toilet day
- Up gradation of model schools to 3 star
- 2358 schools with active child cabinet were engaged in WASH planning, implementation and monitoring and with daily hand washing with soap before MDM is institutionalized.
- 2045 schools of 1 and 2 Star schools(SVP 2017-18 WASH benchmarking) reached 3 star and above rating and also have completed at least one WASH benchmarking during the reporting period.
- 05 schools are developed as WASH models and in turn 05 innovative models of wash in schools developed HWWS, running water, O&M systems available and documented

- Daily hand washing- The students of the school wash their hands with soap before midday meal
- Students started using the toilet instead of open defecation. The boys and girls are using separate toilets in the school.
